The Department of Surgery at Johns Hopkins Hospital at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine seeks candidates for an Assistant Professor position in Endocrine Surgery. The applicant should have completed formal post-residency fellowship training in Endocrine Surgery. Participation in trainee education and research endeavors are expected.

Clinical responsibilities will consist of evaluation and management of endocrine surgical conditions, including benign and malignant thyroid, parathyroid and adrenal pathologies, both at the Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, as well as at one or more affiliated local/regional centers. This opportunity will involve additional clinical responsibilities, including limited in-house Emergency General Surgery in-house coverage, during initial development of a robust elective Endocrine Surgery practice.

Trainee supervision and instruction are a major component of the position. Education is focused on an Endocrine Surgery Fellow (the Johns Hopkins Endocrine Surgery Fellowship is approved and administered by the American Association of Endocrine Surgeons), general surgery residents, medical students and physician assistant students. The attending is expected to participate in formal didactic teaching.

Research endeavors will be encouraged and supported. Opportunities for clinical research and outcome studies are abundant. Our current faculty maintain close collaborations with the Johns Hopkins Surgery Center for Outcomes Research (JSCOR), The Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, and the Armstrong Institute for Patient Safety and Quality.

Applicants must have an MD, MD/PhD or equivalent degree and should be certified (or eligible for certification) by the American Board of Surgery.
