What is Endocrine Surgery?

Endocrine surgeons are experts in surgical diseases of the thyroid, parathyroid, adrenal glands as well as in neuroendocrine tumors of the pancreas and GI tract.

What is the training pathway for an endocrine surgeon?

In the US, the typical pathway for an endocrine surgeon is the completion of a general surgery residency program followed by an endocrine surgery fellowship. The clinical portion of an endocrine surgery fellowship is typically one year. Some fellows elect for a second year of fellowship to further build expertise in endocrine surgery research.

What is a typical week for an endocrine surgeon?

Endocrine surgeons will see patients in clinic for conditions such as hyperparathyroidism, thyroid nodules, thyroid cancer, Graves disease, pheochromocytoma, aldosteronoma, adrenal Cushing's syndrome and neuroendocrine tumors. Many endocrine surgeons are facile in bedside ultrasound and fine needle biopsy, which is performed in clinic. Once the workup is completed and the patients are deemed suitable surgical candidates, patients will be scheduled for surgery. Most endocrine surgical disease are highly curable which promotes high levels of job satisfaction for endocrine surgeons. Many endocrine surgeons will also have a blend of teaching, research and administrative responsibilities, as the predictability of the clinical schedule enables scheduled time for other responsibilities.
