Fellowship aims	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To train surgeons who are likely to be future leaders in academic endocrine surgery. • To provide an extensive experience in the diagnostic and operative management of patients with common and rare endocrine surgical conditions. • To promote clinical and basic science research in the field of surgical endocrinology and oncology.
Fellowship description & curriculum	<p>The University of Sydney Endocrine Surgical Unit has an annual caseload of approximately 1300 endocrine surgical cases. These include over 200 new thyroid cancer presentations, 300 parathyroid procedures, 70 adrenalectomy procedures and 30 parotid cases per year.</p> <p>Fellows will receive a comprehensive exposure to operative surgery both as an independent operator and assistant, and will coordinate the endocrine surgical service at Royal North Shore Hospital. Multidisciplinary outpatient clinics are run weekly with high level exposure to point of care ultrasound and fibre-optic laryngoscopy.</p> <p>A bi-weekly research meeting and journal club program aims to fulfil the learning objectives as set out by the Australia and New Zealand Endocrine Surgeons Association and American Association of Endocrine Surgeons.</p>

<p>Eligibility and Timeline</p>	<p>Candidates should have completed training in General Surgery and be able to participate on an Acute General Surgical Emergency Roster. Please provide an updated CV and 2 letters of recommendation.</p> <p>Applications for the TS Reeve Fellowship are NOT part of the AAES match. Candidates will be notified of outcomes prior to the AAES match taking place.</p> <p>Application Deadline:</p> <p>Applications are due by the 1st of May yearly and the successful candidate will be expected to commence the Fellowship in July of the following year.</p>
